About CEF SLAIN project

The project's Action fits in the EC's 2010 Communication 'Towards a European Road Safety Area' and aims to contribute to the long-term goal for zero road deaths in 2050.

The European Commission CEF funded project SLAIN (Saving Lives Assessing and Improving TEN-T road Network safety) aims to extend the skills and knowledge base of partners in performing network-wide road assessment.

European Road Assessment Program (EuroRAP) is the overall Project Coordinator of SLAIN with partners: Anas, FPZ, RSI Panos Mylonas, RACC-ACASA, DGT Spain, SCT Spain, TES Spain (Catalonia), iRAP.

The main areas to be covered within the SLAIN project are:

- Demonstration of a methodology of network-wide assessment
- Network-wide road safety assessments (accident and impact severity risk and safety rating) in 4 European countries: Croatia, Italy, Greece and Spain (covering 10,000 km)
- Proposals of section-specific, economically-viable crash countermeasures designed to raise infrastructure quality to achieve significant reductions in severe injuries and deaths
- Preparation of the readiness of Europe's physical infrastructure for automation (Road Markings and Traffic Signs) covering 2,000km in 4 European countries: Croatia, Italy, Greece and Spain
- 100 Case Studies around Europe
- SLAIN Policy recommendations
